In order to have a neat display, please adhere to the following:

- Work must not be traced or copied.
- Each teacher, including art teachers, may enter a maximum of two entries from any one grade, for each class number listed below. If a teacher has multiple sessions of the same grade, that teacher may enter a total of two entries per session for each class listed below. Individual entries, including Home and Cyber School, may exhibit one entry in each class listed below. **Beginning in 2021, there will only be one schoolhouse entry form. Please use this form for entering both Teacher and Individual entries.**
- CLASS PROJECT ENTRIES: may exhibit one entry (a group effort) in each of the Group Categories (i.e. several students working to complete the same project. Ex. Class book or mural).
- GROUP PROJECT entries or multi-age groups such as Scouts, Church Groups, Camps, etc. may enter under Department 20.
- All matting is limited to one inch.
- The maximum size of any entry is 3'x4'.
- Do not use beans, seeds, salt, sugar, flour, noodles, or any other food in entries. Projects containing these items will not be accepted.
- As in the past, you are required to write the students names on the entry form. Please also write the student's name on the tags when you receive them.
- The name of the student, the teacher, the school district, and the classification must be written on the back of all entries.
- Tags must be attached to the upper left-hand corner of each project with two staples. Tear off the claim ticket, turn up the bottom, and tuck under the flap. **DO NOT** staple the flap up.
- All exhibits must be picked up on Sunday, August 22nd between 8:00am and 12:00noon.

Section 998 – 2021 Youth Poster Contest

The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture will once again conduct a statewide poster contest at the agricultural fairs. Participating Fairs will hold their own contests and submit one poster from each age group to the state level for additional judging and cash prizes. **To enter:** use the Schoolhouse Entry Form in online Premium Book for the school exhibits: use Department 11, Section 998, and Class 1, 2, or 3.

Criteria for the Harford Fair Poster Contest

The prize money at the Harford Fair in each class will be: 1st place - \$10.00

2nd place - \$7.50

3rd place - \$5.00

- Only one poster may be submitted per student, per age group. There will be three state competitions by age. Student must be in the age group by June 1 to qualify. Class 1 – ages 8-11, Class 2 – ages 12-14, Class 3 – ages 15-18.
- The poster size must be 14x22 inches or 14 ½ x22 inches.
- This year’s theme is **“Imagine the Opportunities.”** Exhibitors are encouraged to submit artwork that highlights careers and new trends in agriculture. In addition to traditional farming activities, participants are encouraged to explore specialized areas of the agriculture industry, as well as the new and improved methods, tools, and technologies that help in all aspects of the farm industry.
- Only one poster per age group per fair may be forwarded to the state competition. The Fair Secretary is responsible for submitting the entry forms and poster.
- Posters will be evaluated on use of theme, visual appearance, and creativity in relation to the exhibitor’s age.
- The overall winner out of all the classes will receive a prize of \$25.00.
- The prize money at the 2022 PA Farm Show in each age class will be: 1st place: \$100.00, 2nd place: \$75.00, 3rd place: \$50.00

Winners will be notified in advance and invited to attend an awards presentation. They will also be required to provide their social security number for award disbursements. All posters will become property of the PA Department of Agriculture for possible future promotional activities for the PA Farm Show and PA State Association of County Fairs. Any duplication of posters from previous years will be disqualified. Posters will not be returned via mail but may be returned via arrangements made with your fair.
