## ◆◆◆◆◆ Department Rules ◆◆◆◆◆

Exhibitors must adhere to the IAFE Code of Ethics. Exhibitors must adhere to the Harford Fair General Rules. Please read all General and Department Rules before making entries.

1. To enter: go to [www.harfordfair.com](http://www.harfordfair.com), click on the link and follow the instructions to enter online or use the Beef Entry Blank below or in the online Harford Fair Premium Book and **please include an entry fee of \$3.00 per animal.**
2. All **purebred cattle class** entries must include the registration name and number, the owner, breeder, sire and dam. **Unregistered females** will show as “Crossbred” (breed), regardless of lineage. Market entries must include the animal date of birth and ear tag number. All entries, including Group Classes, must be on the Beef Entry Form. If space becomes a problem, entries will be accepted in the order they are received.
3. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor. If buying an animal, ownership must be finalized by day of show (not pending).
4. Registration papers and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) must accompany the animal and be approved before the animal can be unloaded on the Fairgrounds.
5. Exhibitors must have all animals entered for competition on the Fairgrounds on Sunday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 between 7:00am and 11:00am for market animals, and 8:00am and 12:00 noon for breeding animals. Market animals will be weighed at 12:00noon. Entries not part of the 4-H Program may leave at the conclusion of the dairy show on Wednesday. All 4-H animals must remain until 8:00am on Sunday, unless released by the Superintendent through prior arrangement.
6. Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent, accept their stall assignments without controversy, and to cooperate with the Superintendent in every way to preserve the educational value of the show. Requests for stall preference must accompany entries, No stalls are promised.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for know when their stock will be judged. Failure to present animals at the ring when called will result in disqualification.
8. All animals shown in Group Classes must complete in the individual classes. All calves shown with cows in the Cow/Calf Classes: a) must show in the respective calf class; and b) count as a separate entry for entry fees.
9. Only original bedding will be furnished. All exhibitors must furnish their own feed and watering equipment. Straw will be available for sale on the Fairgrounds. Approved bedding is straw, hay, or tan bark. Sawdust alone may not be used for bedding.
10. **ALL BEEF CATTLE MUST BE STALLED WITH A DOUBLE TIE.** All bulls over eight months of age must have a permanent nose ring in place.

## ❖❖❖❖ 2021 Health Requirements ❖❖❖❖

### **Pennsylvania Cattle:**

- 1) All animals must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2021. The CVI must remain on the Fairgrounds with the exhibitor and be available for inspection at any time.
  - 2) All animals must be free of infectious, contagious, or parasitic diseases, and a statement of this is required on the CVI (is pre-printed on CVI).
  - 3) All animals must have an official ear tag or a breed registration tattoo.
  - 4) All animals over three (3) months of age (except market cattle) must have a current (within 180 days of show) rabies vaccination show proof of vaccination with: a) a valid rabies certificate (or copy of): or b) the rabies vaccination information must be included on the CVI
  - 5) A Tuberculosis test is not required.
  - 6) A Brucellosis test is not required.
  - 7) All animals must be immunized against IBR, P13, BRSV, and BVD. A statement of this must be included on the CVI.
- \*\*\*Special note –** Animals that have never been vaccinated against BVD or have not been vaccinated against BVD during the previous 12 months must receive: a) one dose of modified live virus vaccine given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the Show; or b) two doses of killed virus vaccine, given two to four weeks apart, with the last dose at least 15 days, and not more than 180 days before the Show. **The date of the last modified live virus vaccination, or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the CVI.** Hyper-immune serum may not be used as a substitute for the above vaccination requirement. **Animals without proper vaccination will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds.**

### **Out of State Cattle:**

- 1) All animals must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within 30 days prior to the start of the Harford Fair. If an animal comes from a state in which Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) has been identified, or a bordering state, the CVI shall include a statement verifying “All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from Vesicular Stomatitis. During the past 90 days, these animals have neither been exposed to VS nor located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.”
- 2) All animals must be free of infectious, contagious, or parasitic diseases, and a statement of this is required on the CVI (is pre-printed on CVI).
- 3) All animals must have an official ear tag or a breed registration tattoo.
- 4) All animals over three (3) months of age (except market cattle) must have a current (within 180 days of show) rabies vaccination show proof of vaccination with: a) a valid rabies certificate (or copy of): or b) the rabies vaccination information must be included on the CVI.
- 5) Tuberculosis: No test is required for animals originating from “Accredited Free” states. All animals originating from states designated “Modified Accredited Advanced” must test negative within 60 days prior to date of importation. The negative test results and the date of the test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (or copy of). All animals originating from states designated “Modified Accredited” must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age or older be test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals to be imported (all ages) are test negative within the 60 days prior to importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test. The test results and the date of the test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (or copy).
- 6) Brucellosis: No test is required for animals originating from a Brucellosis-free state or are members of a Certified Brucellosis-free herd. Unvaccinated animals over 8 months of age and all animals over 14 months of age originating from Brucellosis Class A, B and C states shall be Brucellosis test negative within 60 days of the date of the show. The test results and date of the test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative laboratory test report (or copy of). An approved laboratory in the state of origin or Canada shall conduct an official blood test for Brucellosis, and the imported test-eligible animals shall be negative on an officially approved Brucellosis test.
